

ANNUAL REPORT – 2008- 2009 - NIZHAL

This year has seen an explosion of activities by Nizhal that have had far reaching impacts than ever before. Our Mission, Vision and Objectives have been formalized:

Vision

Nizhal's vision is to be an effective catalyst in greening, particularly in urban areas, with a special focus on regenerating biodiversity.

Mission

The Mission of Nizhal is to promote tree culture, particularly in urban areas, by creating awareness of the role of trees, planting the right kind of trees and caring for trees, through collaborative efforts.

- 1 Nizhal is dedicated to conservation, because we believe that everyone has a responsibility towards the well being of the natural world.
- 2. Nizhal's three main goals are
- to preserve biodiversity
- to strengthen the bond between people and nature
- to promote awareness of trees, and sensitivity to the trees around us.
- 3. Nizhal believes that real progress in nature conservation demands sincere partnerships based on mutual trust with local communities, organizations and citizens, especially young people.

LANDMARK INITIATIVES....

PWD Park, Kotturpuram

The PWD Tree Park in Kotturpuram was initiated early in 2008 as a joint project of PWD, Nizhal and Citizens Committee, to commemorate the 150th year of the PWD. More than 200 saplings have been planted in the first phase, and are regularly monitored by our volunteers. This will be a special tree park containing a large number of different species both indigenous, naturalised and special trees such as tropical, dry, evergreen forest trees common to the Coromandel Coast. The area has been mapped to show the name and location of the saplings.

The saplings have been planted by the students of AMM School, Anna University, Kids Central, the citizens of Kotturpuram and other corporate volunteers.



The Shramdaan idea suggested by a senior member, Mr Gowrishankar, is being carried out by college students of SRM Eswari and Sri Venkateshwara College of Engineering, volunteers from NGO Bhumi and employees of various corporate companies like GE Money, Scope International, TCS, CTS, Scope etc. This project has elicited a tremendous response from corporate volunteers and student communities alike.

Puzhal - Sensitive Greening in the Prison Campus

Greening in the Puzhal Campus was initiated in March 2009, to green the campus with a diversity of appropriate species to beautify and create a cool and pleasant environment in and around. Methods of rain water harvesting, composting, and kitchen gardens are being introduced in a phase manner. A Horticulture Training Module as a certificate course will be offered with the help of experts for inmates as a livelihood option.

We have also received request from prisons across the state to initiate greening in their respective campuses. It has already been initiated in Madurai with the help of Mr. Vishwanathan.

Greening of the area in front of Kasturba Nagar MRTS was supervised by Mr Raghavendra Rao and Dr Dayanandam in November 2008 supported by Satyam Foundation. Shramdaan and monitoring activities are being carried out regularly by Nizhal volunteers.

Nizhal sponsored the planting in front of the Kotturpuram MRTS station. The local community is also actively involved in tree care and maintenance.

Tree Walks



A number of tree walks were conducted in the last one year which saw a participation of more than 300 enthusiastic citizens, across the city. Open spaces covered include Nageshwara Rao Park, Panagal Park and Thiruvika Park, besides Theosophical society, Kalakshetra Foundation and Guindy National Park.

A Tree Walk every Month!

This idea was initiated six months ago so as to create more awareness about trees in the neighbourhood in different areas.
